



Christ for all Nations Ministry Facts

- Thirty-nine years ago, Evangelist Reinhard Bonnke founded the international ministry of Christ for all Nations (CfaN) after God gave him a vision and put on his heart a mission to share a message of hope through the Gospel with the people of Africa.
- CfaN has recorded 72 million documented decisions for Jesus Christ since 1987 when they started keeping records.
- Some of the very first CfaN crusade, meetings were held in a tent that accommodated 800 people, but as attendance steadily increased, so did the size of the tent. In 1984, Evangelist Bonnke commissioned the construction of the world's largest tent capable of seating 34,000 people. When capacity of this tent was exceeded, CfaN began holding open-air Gospel campaigns with an initial gathering of over 150,000 people per service. Since then as many as 1.6 million people have attended a single meeting.
- As a result of Evangelist Bonnke's work in Africa, over 200 million copies of CfaN literature has been published in 104 languages and printed in 55 countries.
- CfaN currently has ten offices in the United States, Canada, Germany, the United Kingdom, Nigeria, South Africa, Singapore, Australia, Hong Kong and Brazil.
- While CfaN's work has been centered in Africa over the last 39 years, the majority of its funding has come from American Christians.
- CfaN is headquartered in Orlando, Fla., and because German-born Bonnke has spent so much time in America, he has grown very fond of the country. In 2012 Evangelist Bonnke became an American citizen.
- For the first time in his 39-year ministry, Evangelist Bonnke is bringing his message of hope and love to the United States through the "Good News" crusades. CfaN now has fronts in two counties, Africa and America.
- Through CfaN, Evangelist Bonnke has founded the "Reinhard Bonnke School of Fire," an online, self-study course aimed at inspiring others to Holy Spirit Evangelism, as well as "Fire Conferences," events aimed at equipping church leaders and workers for evangelism.
- Evangelist Bonnke has already chosen his predecessor, Daniel Kolenda, who has been working alongside Evangelist Bonnke for four years. Evangelist Kolenda started his work at CfaN in the mail room and now speaks to crowds of hundreds of thousands of people in Africa.
