More than 1 million babies die on the first day of life – making it the most dangerous day for babies in nearly every country, rich and poor alike. Save the Children's 14th annual **State of the World's Mothers** report once again ranks the best and worst places in the world to be a mother.

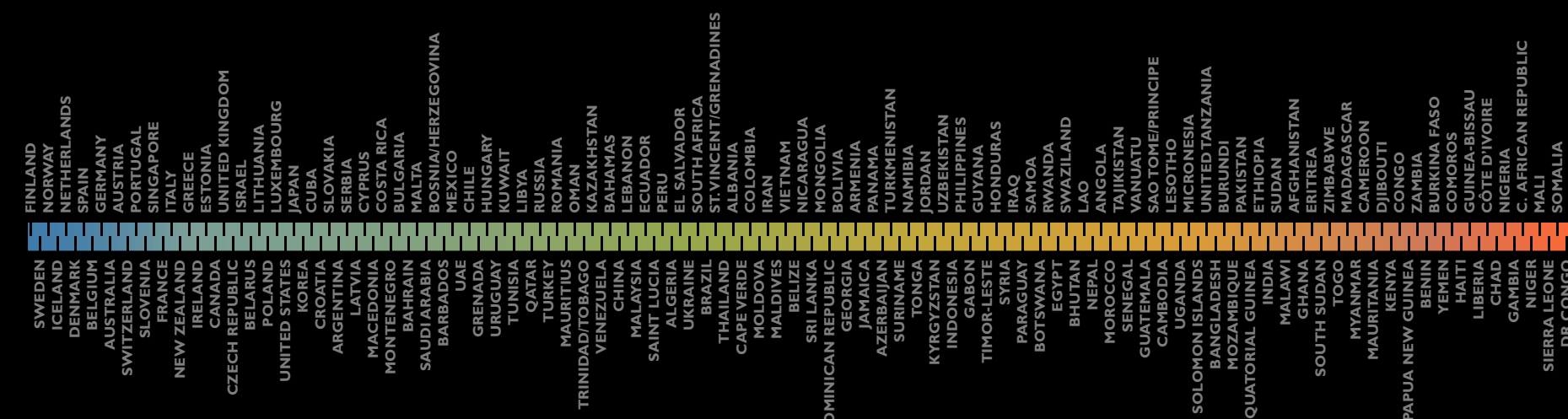

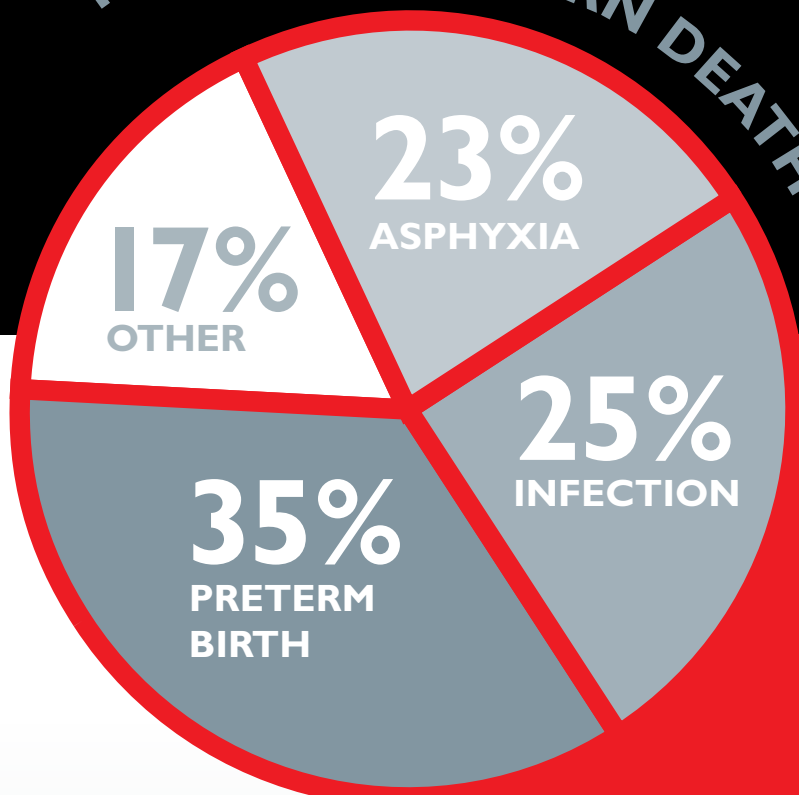

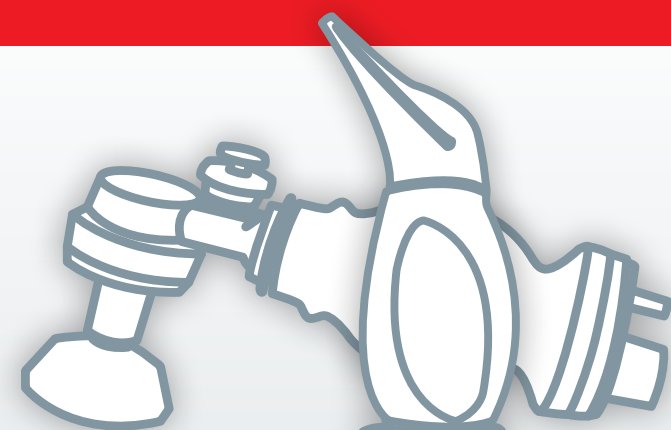

4 Lifesaving Solutions



▼ SPEEDING UP GROWTH CORTICOSTEROIDS

When babies are born too soon, their lungs may not be fully developed and many don't survive. But for 51¢, a pregnant woman can get a simple steroid injection to help her baby's lungs mature.

▲ CLEAN CORD CARE CHLORHEXIDINE

It's hard to believe, but belly button infections can be fatal for vulnerable newborns. For just 10¢ per use, the antiseptic chlorhexidine can save lives when used to clean umbilical cords and belly buttons.

▼ FIGHTING INFECTION ANTIBIOTICS

One of the common risks of birth is a deadly blood infection called sepsis. Injectable antibiotics can easily treat sepsis and other severe infections (e.g. pneumonia) for as little as 13¢.

▲ BREATHING LIFE RESUSCITATION EQUIPMENT

Some babies need help taking their first breath. A basic, resuscitation device costs just \$6 and has helped millions of babies let out a cry to declare their birth.
