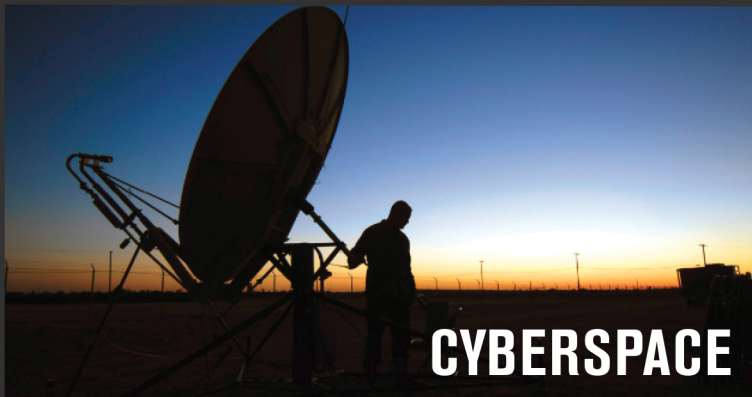


ABOUT AIR NATIONAL GUARD CAREERS
