



Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is All Access?

- All Access is a collection of music and cultural events that will take place simultaneously in five cities on September 10, 2016. The All Access events will unite reproductive health, rights, and justice supporters across the country to support abortion access for everyone who needs it.
- The All Access concerts will be anchored in Cleveland with satellite events happening in Miami, Atlanta, Chicago, and Philadelphia. Additional events including poetry slams, dinners, and dance parties will be scattered across the country.
- The biggest names in music and comedy will join forces with the country's leading artists and creative voices to share their stories about why access to abortion strengthens women, their families, and ultimately, the country.

2. What is the purpose of All Access?

- All Access is a powerful social event that brings together people of all ages, ethnicities, racial and gender identities to commit to defending our access to abortion and celebrate our collective power.
- All Access will magnify the voice of the majority of Americans – 7 in 10 – who support access to abortion while equipping and energizing people to share their experiences about abortion access with their family, friends, and community.
- All Access will encourage and inspire supporters to share their stories and be vocal advocates to ensure that abortion access is available to everyone.

3. Why is All Access so important?

- Since the 2010 midterm election, states have quietly passed more than 334 individual restrictions to block women from accessing abortion. Political interference shouldn't dictate what a woman chooses to do with her own health care decisions.
- As a result of harsh and medically unnecessary restrictions, 88% of US counties have no abortion provider. A third of women of reproductive age don't live in a county with access to an abortion provider.
- The recent Supreme Court victory in *Whole Woman's Health v. Hellerstedt* continues the powerful momentum against political interference in a woman's right to safe, legal abortion but the work doesn't end here. This was just the first step in dismantling hundreds of medically unnecessary laws aimed at making it harder for women to exercise their rights.

4. Who is involved in the All Access coalition?

- The All Access coalition spans a diverse range of age, race, ethnicity, gender identity, political philosophy, and geography. The coalition includes ACLU, Advocates for Youth, All* Above All, The Center for Reproductive Rights, NARAL Pro-Choice America Foundation, National Asian Pacific American Women's Forum, In Our Own Voice: National Black Women's Reproductive Justice Agenda, National Council of Jewish Women, National Latina Institute for Reproductive Health, National Network of Abortion Funds, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, SisterSong, URGE: Unite for Reproductive & Gender Equity, Whole Woman's Health.
