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WORLD PREMATURITY DAY

WHAT: Third annual World Prematurity Day to raise awareness about the issue of premature birth

around the world.

WHY: Premature birth is a very serious health problem. Worldwide, 15 million babies are born preterm

and more than a million die as a result. Babies who survive often have lifelong health problems

such as cerebral palsy, vision and hearing loss, and intellectual disabilities.

WHEN: Sunday, November 17, 2013

WHERE: Families and volunteers can send their friends a "virtual hug" to show that they care about premature babies. The "Hugs" campaign helps dramatize benefits of Kangaroo care, which is

when parents cuddle their premature skin-to-skin. Kangaroo care is one of the most comforting things parents can do for their child. It also can improve the baby's health by keeping the baby

warm, stabilizing the baby's heart rate, helping the baby gain weight and reducing discomfort.

Anne Geddes, world-renowned photographer known for her pictures of infants, filmed a "virtual hug" for the March of Dimes campaign. She also donated a one of her photographs of international singer Celine Dion for us to use as a public service announcement. Through the PSA, Celine Dion asks the international community to join her for a second year in the fight to end

premature birth.
