Anthony Lembo, MD, is Director of the GI Motility and Functional Bowel Disorders Program at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School in Boston, Mass.

Dr. Lembo earned his medical degree from Tufts University School of Medicine in Boston and completed his residency in medicine, as well as fellowships in gastroenterology and gastrointestinal motility and irritable bowel syndrome (IBS), at the University of California, Los Angeles, (UCLA) Medical Center.

Dr. Lembo's research interests focus on the burden of and treatment options for irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) and chronic constipation, and he also studies the placebo response. He has published widely on these topics, in leading peer-reviewed journals such as *Gastroenterology*, *Neurogastroenterology and Motility*, *Alimentary Pharmacology & Therapeutics*, *Clinical and Translational Gastroenterology* as well as *Digestive Diseases and Sciences*. He also served as an editor or on the review board for several industry renowned journals, including the *New England Journal of Medicine*, *American Journal of Gastroenterology*, *Gastroenterology & Hepatology*, *Journal of Gastroenterology and Hepatology Research* and most recently, *American Journal of Case Reports*.

Dr. Lembo is also an active member of many professional societies including the American Gastroenterological Association, the American Neurogastroenterology and Motility Society, and the American College of Gastroenterology. He has been appointed numerous national and international leadership positions throughout his tenure.
