



The DUPIXENT Patient Support Program: DUPIXENT MyWay

About DUPIXENT[®]

DUPIXENT is the first and only FDA-approved injectable biologic for the treatment of adult patients with moderate-to-severe atopic dermatitis (AD) that is not well controlled with prescription therapies on the skin (topical), or who cannot use topical therapies. DUPIXENT is a targeted biologic designed to inhibit signaling of IL-4 and IL-13, two key cytokines, required for the type 2 (including Th2) immune response, which are believed to be major drivers in AD.

Do not use if you are allergic to dupilumab or to any of the ingredients in DUPIXENT[®].

Overview of DUPIXENT MyWay

Regeneron and Sanofi are committed to helping ensure eligible adult patients with uncontrolled moderate-to-severe atopic dermatitis receive access to DUPIXENT and appropriate financial support.

DUPIXENT MyWay is a comprehensive and specialized program that provides support and services throughout every step of the treatment process with DUPIXENT.

Coverage Support

Coverage support is available for people who require assistance navigating the complex insurance process.

Education and Personalized Nurse Support

A dedicated, personalized approach is available to educate and empower patients to use DUPIXENT as prescribed. Registered nurses are also available to speak with patients about DUPIXENT 24/7.

Patient and Co-pay Assistance

DUPIXENT MyWay helps eligible patients get access to therapy whether they are uninsured, lack coverage, or need assistance with their out-of-pocket costs. Co-pay support is available for people who have commercial insurance to help cover the cost of DUPIXENT. A pharmacy locator is also available to show patients where their DUPIXENT prescription can be filled.

Injection Training

DUPIXENT is a self-administered, single-dose (one time use) pre-filled syringe, given as an injection under the skin (subcutaneously). The *DUPIXENT MyWay* program offers injection training services, including registered nurses who are available upon request to help patients understand the proper way to inject DUPIXENT, as instructed by their healthcare provider.

- FDA-approved sharps disposal container shipped upon request for safe needle disposal
- Additional tips and tools, such as disease education and product information materials, to help adult patients with moderate-to-severe AD

Important Safety Information and Indication (cont'd)

Before using DUPIXENT, tell your healthcare provider about all your medical conditions, including if you:

- have eye problems
- have a parasitic (helminth) infection
- have asthma
- are scheduled to receive any vaccinations. You should not receive a “live vaccine” if you are treated with DUPIXENT.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known whether DUPIXENT will harm your unborn baby.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known whether DUPIXENT passes into your breast milk.

Tell your healthcare provider about all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins and herbal supplements. If you have asthma and are taking asthma medicines, do not change or stop your asthma medicine without talking to your healthcare provider.

DUPIXENT can cause serious side effects, including:

- **Allergic reactions.** Stop using DUPIXENT and go to the nearest hospital emergency room if you get any of the following symptoms: fever, general ill feeling, swollen lymph nodes, hives, itching, joint pain, or skin rash.
- **Eye problems.** Tell your healthcare provider if you have any new or worsening eye problems, including eye pain or changes in vision.

The most common side effects include injection site reactions, eye and eyelid inflammation, including redness, swelling and itching, and cold sores in your mouth or on your lips.

Tell your healthcare provider if you have any side effect that bothers you or that does not go away. These are not all the possible side effects of DUPIXENT. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects. You may report side effects to FDA at 1-800-FDA-1088.

Use DUPIXENT exactly as prescribed. If your healthcare provider decides that you or a caregiver can give DUPIXENT injections, you or your caregiver should receive training on the right way to prepare and inject DUPIXENT. **Do not** try to inject DUPIXENT until you have been shown the right way by your healthcare provider.

INDICATION

DUPIXENT is used to treat adult patients with moderate-to-severe atopic dermatitis (eczema) that is not well controlled with prescription therapies used on the skin (topical), or who cannot use topical therapies. DUPIXENT can be used with or without topical corticosteroids. It is not known if DUPIXENT is safe and effective in children.
