#TreatType2 FAQs

Who is eligible to participate in this program?

Anyone with a prescription for any or all of these three medications (metformin, glipizide and pioglitazone) can receive their Rx for free, for a year. All patients have to do is create a free account on Blink Health. The program is also available to all existing Blink members.

How do I get my medication?

Patients can pick up their medication at their local pharmacy. Blink Health is accepted at over 57,000 pharmacies nationwide, including CVS, Rite-Aid, Target, Walmart and many independent pharmacies.

Does this program cover insulin?

No, this offer applies only to the three most prescribed generic medications for type-2 diabetes. Blink Health is also working on solutions to help lower the price of insulin. Earlier this year, Blink announced a first-of-its-kind access program with Eli Lilly to offer a 40 percent discount on Lilly insulins, including Humalog, one of the most widely prescribed branded insulin medications.

Do I need to have insurance to participate in this program?

No, insurance is not required.

Can I participate if I have commercial insurance or Medicare/Medicaid?

Yes.

What happens at the end of the year? Can I still get my medication through Blink? How much will it cost?

Yes, you can continue to fill your prescriptions through Blink Health and receive discounted pricing on these products.
