NORTHERN TERRITORY / QUEENSLAND

[Boodjamulla \(Lawn Hill\) National Park](#)

Sitting on the border of the Northern Territory and Queensland, Boodjamulla (Lawn Hill) National Park encompasses Lawn Hill Gorge and the Riversleigh World Heritage Site. The emerald waters and lush vegetation of Lawn Hill Gorge form a beautiful oasis in the outback, attracting abundant wildlife and offering exceptional views, walks, canoeing and cultural sites. The Riversleigh fossil deposits are among the richest and most extensive in the world, with some fossils dating back 25 million years.

QUEENSLAND

[Mission Beach](#)

Mission Beach is a relaxed beachfront town between Cairns and Townsville on the Queensland coast. Here two World Heritage areas, the Great Barrier Reef and Wet Tropics Rainforest, form a natural environment like nowhere else on earth. Mission Beach is a gateway to the Great Barrier Reef and a perfect base for visiting nearby Dunk, Bedarra and Hinchinbrook islands.

[Great Barrier Reef](#)

The 2,300 kilometre (1,430 mile) Great Barrier Reef is the largest coral reef system in the world. It is made up of 3,000 coral reefs, 600 continental islands and 300 coral cays. Visitors can snorkel and dive among vivid coral gardens and colourful fish or view the reef from above with a scenic helicopter ride.

NEW SOUTH WALES

[Quay Restaurant](#)

The 2017 Sydney Morning Herald Good Food Restaurant of the Year, Quay is one of Australia's most awarded and celebrated restaurants. Set in the heart of Sydney Harbour, Quay has one of the best outlooks of any restaurant in Australia, with spectacular panoramic views taking in Circular Quay, the Sydney Opera House and Sydney Harbour Bridge.

Sydney Harbour is an aquatic playground for Sydneysiders, with more than 240 kilometres (150 miles) of shoreline, punctuated by unspoiled beaches, picturesque gardens and pockets of natural bush. It is also home to some of Australia's big-name attractions, including the Sydney Opera House and Sydney Harbour Bridge. Taking a high-speed jet boat is just one of the many ways to take in the sights of one of the world's most beautiful natural harbours.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

[Kangaroo Island](#)

Kangaroo Island, 13 kilometres (8 miles) off the coast of South Australia and 30 minutes by plane from Adelaide, is brimming with native animals, some of which aren't found anywhere else. It is also home to an established artisanal food scene, and one of the world's best hotels, Southern Ocean Lodge. More than one third of the island is protected by conservation areas and national parks, while lush farmland and small towns make up much of the rest. The island, known to the locals as "KI", is divided into seven regions, with four major towns: Kingscote (the island's relaxed capital), Penneshaw (where daily ferries disembark), American River, and Parndana.

VICTORIA

Montalto produces premium cool climate wine on the Mornington Peninsula, a beautiful region with rolling hills, orchards, olive groves, historic mansions, and over 200 vineyards specialising in Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. This unique offering has been awarded Best Winery Tourism Destination by *Australian Gourmet Traveller* magazine and given a 5-star rating by Australian wine critic and vigneron James Halliday.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

[Cable Beach](#)

Broome's Cable Beach is known around the world for its 22 kilometres of sun-kissed white sand, turquoise water, rich red soil and spectacular Indian Ocean sunsets. Cable Beach is a long, flat beach, with gentle rolling waves perfect for swimming, sunbathing and beachcombing. Ride a camel along the beach at sunrise or sunset.
