

## **John Elway, NFL Quarterback Hall of Famer and Denver Broncos General Manager**

John Elway, 59, holds a prominent place among football's legends, boasting a 16-year professional career playing for the Denver Broncos, and now serving as the General Manager for the Broncos. As a quarterback, John played in five Super Bowls, winning two of them in 1998 and 1999. He was also the Super Bowl MVP in 1999 and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2004. In his current position leading the Broncos, he has added two more Super Bowl appearances and one more victory to his resume. Outside of football, John's interests include running two successful steakhouses and devoting time to the Elway Foundation, which fights child abuse. John lives with his family in Denver, Colorado.

In 2005, John was diagnosed with Dupuytren's contracture, a progressive hand condition that causes the fingers to bend toward the palm to the point where they cannot be straightened. John's hands have been everything to him throughout his career, but he waited to get treated, as he thought surgery was his only option – until he learned about nonsurgical treatments. Now, John has joined the *Facts on Hand* educational campaign to spread the word and encourage anyone who thinks they may have the condition to speak to a hand specialist.
