2023 FIRST LADY'S COMMEMORATIVE EGG



AMERICAN EGG BOARD, ON BEHALF OF AMERICA'S EGG FARMERS

- The American Egg Board has presented the First Lady with the First Lady's Commemorative Egg on behalf of America's egg farmers for **46 years**.
- The first presentation in 1977 was made to First Daughter Amy Carter, with a hand-painted egg that featured her name and the White House surrounded by flowers and a rabbit.
- Over time and as the America's egg farmers support of this iconic event grew, the presentation became linked with the First Lady and the White House Easter Egg Roll.
- The First Lady's Commemorative Egg is an actual chicken egg that is handcrafted each year by a talented
 artist that specializes in egg artistry. The design can take many forms and involves a range of mixed media,
 per the artist's preference.
- Over the years, eggs have reflected the passions of America's first ladies. Presidential pets have even appeared
 on the First Lady's Commemorative Egg, most recently including Bo, the pet of the Obama family, in 2009.
- The 2023 First Lady's Commemorative Egg design will showcase **Dr. Jill Biden's commitment to ensuring all Americans have access to a quality education,** as part of the White House Easter "EGGucation" Roll.
- The White House Easter "EGGucation" Roll—hosted by the President and the First Lady—is expected to bring over **30,000 attendees** together.
- Designed by Carolyn Bickel, a self-taught artist originally from northern New York and who currently
 resides in Nashville, Tennessee, the 2023 First Lady's Commemorative Egg design captures how children
 can reach for the stars, one book at a time.
- This year's First Lady's Commemorative Egg is hand-painted with images of children in the grass reading together, with the spines of a stack of books behind them bearing the words, "unity," "compassion," "kindness," and "connection," and a girl standing atop a winged book as she reaches toward a starlit sky.
- It was constructed as a **jewel box design** which has a hinged top that opens to reveal a miniature Easter scene featuring another smaller egg—this one laid by a "pullet" which is a 4 to 5 month hen. The tiny egg has been hand-painted with a whimsical bunny and set in spring grass surrounded by even smaller decorative eggs.
- America's egg farmers are **honored to provide this historical legacy** in tribute to the First Ladies of the United States.
