

Ferrovial to implement social infrastructure projects in Colombia, Peru and Tanzania in 2018.

- Ferrovial has launched 22 projects which provide access to water and sanitation infrastructure in Africa and Latin America in the ten years since the program commenced.
- In Spain, it will help refurbish meal centers and food banks for the Spanish Red Cross.
- The projects represent an overall investment of more than 600,000 euro.

Madrid, 22/02/2018.- Around 15,000 people will see a significant improvement in their living conditions as a result of the water and sanitation infrastructure projects to be developed by Ferrovial in partnership with various NGOs in Africa and Latin America. In addition to the monetary contribution, Ferrovial employees will volunteer their time to provide technical support throughout the projects. Ferrovial and the NGOs chosen in the 2017 application process today signed collaboration agreements for these projects under the umbrella of the company's "Social Infrastructure" and "Social Action in Spain" programs. Chairman Rafael de Pino and CEO Íñigo Meirás, on behalf of Ferrovial, and José Luis Leal, president of Acción contra el Hambre, Clara Pardo, president of Manos Unidas, Robert Good, president of Save the Children Spain, Manuel Gómez Galán, general manager of Cideal, and Javier Senent, president of the Spanish Red Cross, all took part in the ceremony.

In 2018, Ferrovial will earmark 600,000 euro for its "Social Infrastructure" and "Social Action in Spain" community outreach programs. These programs are part of the company's corporate social responsibility (CSR) program, entitled "Plan 20.19". The four Social Infrastructure projects involving Ferrovial will take place in Colombia, Peru and Tanzania. Since this program was launched in 2008, Ferrovial has allocated more than 5 million euro to ensuring access to drinking water for 215,000 people.

Social Infrastructure

In Peru, in partnership with Save the Children, the company will help improve drinking water and sanitation infrastructure in five schools in the San Juan de Lurigancho district of Lima. This project involves refurbishing five cisterns and building water towers and public toilets, benefiting more than 9,500 people, mainly schoolchildren. Moreover, activities will be conducted to promote hygiene and strengthen local authorities' capacities so as to reduce mortality rates associated with diarrhea and other water-borne diseases.

In Colombia, Ferrovial will partner with CIDEAL in a project in Siete Vueltas, a community located in San Juan de Urabá, to provide more than 2,000 people with reliable access to drinking water. The existing water sources will be upgraded, a water tank and treatment plant will be built to supply the population, and the pipes will be enhanced. Also in Colombia, the company will work with Acción contra el Hambre to build a drinking water treatment plant in San Benito, in the Department of Santander, to benefit 400 people.

Lastly, in Tanzania, the 3,000 inhabitants of the rural community of Lwangu, in the Njombe region, will have access to water thanks to Ferrovial's collaboration with Manos Unidas to build a gravity feed system comprising a 75 m³ tank, 15 km of pipes and 15 supply points. The main problem facing this community is accessibility, since the nearest spring is located 3 km away, a distance that women and children must walk daily to obtain water that is of very poor quality. This water is not suitable for human consumption, so water-borne diseases and illnesses linked to a lack of hygiene are common. Also as part of this program there will be workshops on hygiene and water treatment to train a group of people near the water supply points, so that they in turn can teach the rest of the population and disseminate healthy practices.

Social Action in Spain
